ENRICHMENT will be on a **THURSDAY** after school and **THURSDAY AND WEDNESDAY** from Christmas onwards.



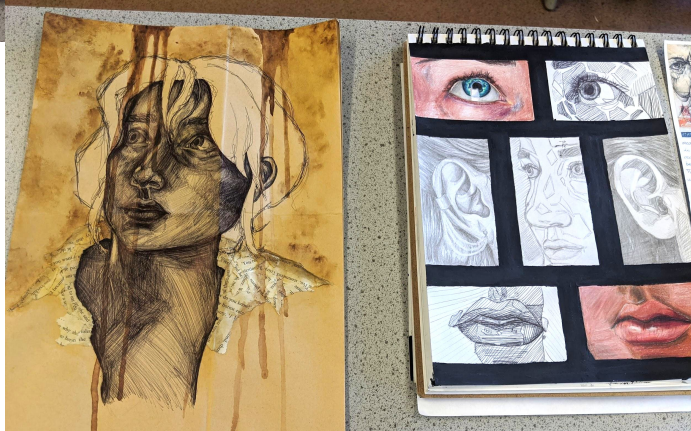

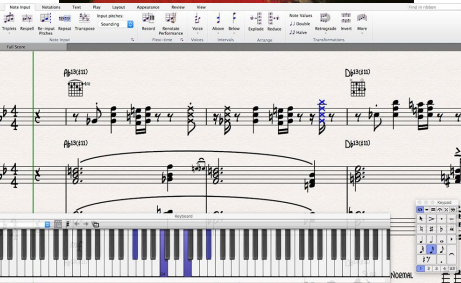
Need Support?
