Dear Parents and Carers

As we have come to the end of another school term, I would like to thank you for your ongoing support for our school and to inform you of some future changes. We look forward to welcoming new members to our team to support our students.

This week, we had the privilege of seeing our musicians perform. I was absolutely blown away by the talent of our students and I look forward to many more fabulous events, now that a more normal service has been resumed. I am very proud of every single person involved.

Our Year II students are studying very hard, and have recently sat their mock exams. Blazer sleeves must not be rolled up. **School shoes must be plain black, <u>no trainers, no Vans, no Converse, no boots, no pumps or canvas shoes, no Vivien Westood style shoes.</u> Shoes should be of a material that can be polished.**
